Canadian Library Month 2015

This past year has been one of transformation for the CLA. We have made changes to our current activities, including the elimination of some programs, in an effort to streamline activity and finances with a view to CLA's future success. Canadian Library Month is one activity/program affected by these changes. CLA will no longer be undertaking CLM.

Executive Council took some time to evaluate and discuss the efficacy and impact of CLM activities on the initiative's goal of highlighting and celebrating the value of libraries alongside CLA's strategic action plan and it was determined that CLA's resources could be better spent on more effective advocacy activities spread throughout the year. We will continue to make the declaration of School Library Day and Library Support Staff Day and we will support the provinces in whatever way we can with their library weeks/months.

Canadian Public Libraries for Fair Ebook Pricing

Canadian Public Libraries for Fair Ebook Pricing have joined to raise awareness of high ebook prices charged by multinational publishers at fairpricingforlibraries.org. Despite booming borrowing rates and high demand for ebooks, public libraries face challenges in ensuring universal access to this content.

Some multinational publishers charge libraries as much as three to five times more for ebooks than the consumer price, while others place caps and time limits on use. This means there are fewer titles and fewer copies for readers to discover.

Canadian Public Libraries for Fair Ebook Pricing will continue to communicate its position to several government and publishing stakeholders, and to work collaboratively with other large public library systems across North America.

The coalition will hold continued conversations with multinational publishers as part of an effort to establish fair and reasonable prices and obtain more ebooks.

Cataloging with RDA eCourse

As more libraries around the world adopt RDA: Resource Description and Access, knowledge of how to catalog library materials using this new standard is a crucial skill. In this eCourse, RDA expert Magda El-Sherbini will get you started with hands-on training that focuses on print monographs and will cover both description and access. You'll also participate in exercises using real-world examples of RDA concepts. El-Sherbini will be available to discuss these concepts and answer your questions on discussion boards, and you'll be able to solidify these skills with quizzes that provide interactive feedback.

Key outcomes:

- * Create original records using RDA
- * Describe manifestation, item, work, and expression
- * Identify and record relationships between entities

Presenter:

Magda El-Sherbini is Head of the Ohio State University Libraries' Cataloging Department. In this capacity, she oversees the department's cataloging activities. She supervises the department's four cataloging units as well as four faculty members and their respective staffs. She also serves on several library committees and is the author of numerous library publications. She has served as a member of the ALA RDA Advisory Board, which addresses issues related to the online publishing of RDA, tests the product online, and provides feedback to the publisher.

The eCourse begins on July 13, 2015. Your participation will require approximately six hours a week, at times that fit your schedule. All activities take place on the website, and you will be expected to:

- * Read, listen to or view online content
- * Post to online discussion boards
- * Complete weekly assignments or activities

Ontario Libraries Capacity Fund (OLCF)

The Research and Innovation (OLCF R&I) stream is now open to accept applications through Grants Ontario. One and two year projects are eligible for funding - one-year projects can receive up to \$100,000 per year; with two-year projects receiving up to \$200,000. OLCF R&I accepts applications from:

- Ontario public libraries, funded under the Public Libraries Act
- an incorporated Ontario public library organization representing or working on behalf of public libraries
- an Ontario Library Service agency
- an incorporated national public library organization, with Ontario representation The <u>OLCF Program Guidelines</u> provide detailed information on eligible projects, expenditures and the application process.
