## **New Hold Lockers at Ottawa Public Library Kiosk Exceed Customers' Expectations**

Ottawa - In the first week of operations, Ottawa Public Library (OPL) customers have shown their satisfaction with the new holds lockers at the Hunt Club-Riverside Park Community Centre (HCRPCC) Kiosk. In total, 86% of the available holds were picked up within five days.

On August 18, OPL launched the first holds pick-up lockers in Ontario, in an effort to increase customer service at the Kiosk location. These new hold lockers allow customers to request items from the Library catalogue and select the Kiosk as the pick-up location to retrieve their items seven days a week, during HCRPCC opening hours. Before the hold lockers were implemented, customers could only pick up their holds during two set times per week.

## The Writers' Union of Canada, Publishing 2.0 - Tips and Traps Workshop


Time is running out to register for the **Publishing 2.0 - Tips and Traps** workshop in **Saskatoon**, and **Edmonton**.
