CLA Executive Director, Valoree McKay, met with Jinny Simms (NDP: Newton - North Delta, BC), Joyce Murray (Liberal: Vancouver Quadra, BC), and The Honourable Wayne Easter (Liberal: Malpeque, PEI) the week of April 7, 2014 to discuss the issue of federal government library closures from the perspective of preservation, access, transparency in the process, and seeking a seat at the discussion table for CLA. All three meetings went well and resulted in some guidance and names for further follow up and an offer of action from each. These offers require some action on CLA's behalf: action that we are working on. Once ready we will reach out to their staff once again. Additional meetings have been scheduled for May 6 and we continue to try to secure a meeting with Government.
