Hot Off the Press

1. Message from CLA Executive Council

CLA Executive Council met on 3-5 February, and discussed CLA's current state.

There is unanimous support across the country for CLA's national advocacy role. And, CLA is gaining recognition as an authoritative voice on federal legislation and issues impacting libraries:

- Bill C-11 on Copyright: CLA was asked to join the discussions, consulted by MPs, and recognized by the federal government to advise on copyright.
- Bill C-321 on the Library Book Rate: CLA was invited by the Minister of Transport to appear at a press conference announcing the government's support for this bill, and continues to work with MP Merv Tweed and members from all parties to ensure it passes.
- Media requests: CLA is increasingly contacted by media from around the country to comment on various issues including school libraries and intellectual freedom.

Membership is being rejuvenated. New Networks are forming and taking action. Committees are addressing key issues within the community. CLA's 2012 conference will provide unique opportunities for advocacy, excellent programs, and a venue to connect with colleagues from across Canada.

Executive Council has made some tough decisions with regard to our finances. CLA has ended 2011 in a sound financial position and has a balanced budget for 2012.

Given these successes, and the recognition for the need to clarify CLA's changing role, Executive Council drafted a new mission:

CLA is the national public voice for Canada's library communities.

We champion library values and the value of libraries.



2. Update on C-11

Bill C-11, *An Act to Amend the Copyright Act*, returned to the House for second reading on Wednesday. The government introduced a motion to impose time allocation on the debate at second reading, which passed. Debate will conclude today, and the expectation is that the House will vote next week to send it to committee. The committee is unlikely to meet before the week of 27 February, as the House is on break for the week of the 20 February.

We are scheduling meetings with committee members to emphasize CLA's position as outlined in <u>our response to the Bill</u>. You can schedule meetings with your MPs during the week of 20 February when they will be in their ridings. The <u>CLA Copyright Toolkit</u> gives you everything you need to reach out to your MP on this issue.
