2. Bill C-321 heads to the Senate

Following a vote in the House of Commons on Wednesday, Bill C-321 on the Library Book Rate again received unanimous support from Members of Parliament. Merv Tweed, MP for Brandon-Souris and sponsor of this private members bill, has confirmed that the bill is now off to the Senate; it is his hope that it will receive Royal Assent by the end of the year. This is a major step forward for this key piece of legislation for the library community! 4. CLA launches advocacy toolkit to support federal libraries

In response to the survey conducted over the past summer on the impact of budget reductions to federal libraries and Library and Archives Canada, CLA has produced an <u>advocacy toolkit</u> to help members raise this issue with their Member of Parliament. The kit includes key talking points, a sample draft letter, and information on how to conduct a meeting with your MP.

Members of Parliament will be in their ridings next week, so this is a great opportunity for you to arrange a meeting.

A report of the results of the survey will be reviewed by Executive Council when they meet on 22-23 October; further information and actions based on that report will be communicated to members after the meeting.
