Of this year's 68 finalists, only 14 will be lucky enough to put the golden GG seal to their book covers. Who will they be?

The Governor General's Literary Awards 2012 winners will be announced on Tuesday, November 13 at 10 am, during a news conference at the <u>Conservatoire de musique et d'art dramatique du Québec</u> in Montreal. Canada's national literary awards celebrate literature for all tastes and ages by honouring the best English-language and the best French-language books in each of 7 categories: fiction, non-fiction, poetry, drama, children's literature (text), children's literature (illustration), and translation.

The winners will speak at the news conference and will be available for in person and telephone interviews immediately following the announcement.

The list of winners, downloadable photographs, and biographical information will be posted on the <u>GG section</u> of the Canada Council website as of 11 a.m. on November 13.

**7.** The Canadian Conference of the Arts to Close Doors after 67 Years The Canadian Conference of the Arts (CCA), the largest national alliance of the arts, culture and heritage sector across Canada, announces that it will begin winding down its operations immediately. Founded in 1945 by a group of eminent artists, including painters Lawren S. Harris, of the Group of Seven, and André Biéler, the CCA has the unique mandate in the Canadian cultural sector of promoting the interests of Canadian artists and of the cultural sector at large at the federal level, and of providing a national forum where issues of common interest can be discussed and pursued. The name of the CCA has been associated with all major cultural policy developments at the federal level, from the creation of the Canada Council for the Arts in 1957 to the UNESCO Convention on the Protection and Promotion of the Diversity of Cultural Expressions in 2005.

## New deadline for the CLA Advancement of Intellectual Freedom in Canada Award - 3 December 2012

To coincide with Freedom to Read Week, the CLA Advancement of Intellectual Freedom in Canada Award will be presented at a special event in February as part of the the Freedom to Read Week celebrations in Toronto. The event is organized by the Book and Periodical Council, with the participation of CLA and The Writers Union of Canada.

The CLA Intellectual Freedom Advisory Committee is now seeking nominations for this Award. The deadline for submissions is **3 December**, **2012**.

#### CLA Advancement of Intellectual Freedom in Canada Award

This award recognizes and honours outstanding contributions to intellectual freedom in Canada by individuals or groups. Preference is given to librarians, other library workers, and library institutions. However like-minded individuals such as teachers or authors and groups such as schools or publishers are also eligible.

#### Criteria:

The general criteria for judging candidates for the award are as follows:

• individuals and institutions having demonstrated leadership and

courage in defending and promoting the principles of intellectual freedom in Canada; or,

- individuals and institutions having demonstrated leadership and courage in resisting censorship and in opposing violations of intellectual freedom pressures in Canada; or,
- individuals and institutions having produced innovative and creative projects, programs, or materials that promote the principles of intellectual freedom in Canada.
