3. OCLC Research and ALISE Name Recipients of 2013 Library and Information Science Research Grants

Congratulations to ÉSIS Director and professor Dr. Lynne Bowker, who has been awarded a prestigious \$15,000 research grant by OCLC Research and the Association of Library Science Education (ALISE) as part of their the 2013 research grant competition. The success rate for this competition was just 15%, meaning that of 20 applications, only three were successful. The awards were presented on January 24 at the ALISE 2013 Annual Conference Awards Reception in Seattle, Washington.

A certified translator and leading researcher in the field of translation technologies, Dr. Bowker will bring together her experience in translation and her interest in information studies in a project entitled "Can machine translation facilitate outreach to newcomers? A pilot study investigating the needs of Spanish-speaking users of the Ottawa Public Library (OPL)." The results of this study will help to determine if machine translation can be used as a partial solution for finding a cost-effective means of translation that would allow OPL to offer a wider range of translated texts to the under-served newcomer community.

CLA Challenges Survey for 2012 - Deadline Extended to March 31, 2013

This is the 7th annual survey of challenges to library materials and policies that is being conducted by the CLA Intellectual Freedom Advisory Committee.

Your responses will help inform the Committee's policy and advocacy work on behalf of the CLA membership. Results are shared widely, for example, with the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions, the Book and Periodical Council [of Canada], and the Office of Intellectual Freedom of the American Library Association. An anonymized version of the database is available without charge to anyone requesting it.

The purpose of the survey is to gather data about the nature and outcomes of challenges to library materials and policies (e.g., collection management, access to Internet and facilities) initiated in
