Hot Off The Press

1. Library and Archives Canada Code of Conduct

The Canadian Library Association urges Library and Archives Canada to revisit its Code of Conduct in order to strike a more even balance between the duty of lovalty to the Government of Canada that all public servants have and the freedom of expression that is imperative to the work of librarians in a strong democracy.

The LAC Code of Conduct: Values and Ethics restricts unnecessarily the ability of librarians and information professionals to perform key aspects of their work, namely teaching and speaking at conferences and other public engagements. The conditions placed upon those activities, and the categorization of those activities as 'high risk,' effectively eliminate the possibility that librarians may engage in essential elements of their work, elements that benefit both themselves and the greater professional community as well as the public good.


The language of the LAC Code also appears to infringe unnecessarily on the personal activities and opinions of public servants beyond the workplace. While we recognize a duty of loyalty to the Government of Canada and its elected officials, a reasonable balance must be maintained in recognizing that public servants also have a first duty of loyalty to Canadians at large.



3. IFLA and CILIP Discuss the Challenges of eBooks in Libraries - Presentations now available

On the 21st of February 2013 the IFLA Management of Library Associations (MLAS) Committee and the Chartered Institute of Library and Information Professionals (CILIP) invited participants to attend a seminar on Ebooks and the challenges faced by libraries titled '<u>eBooks</u> in Libraries – A Global Question of Survival?'. The seminar was attended by experts from all over the world who reported on the situation their libraries face in acquiring and making Ebooks accessible.

In November 2012 IFLA held an <u>Ebook workshop</u> in The Hague which highlighted the issues as well as the positions of both libraries and publishers. The London seminar continued this discussion and furthered the process of identifying and trying to find solutions to the obstacles faced by libraries. During the seminar IFLA publicly launched its <u>Principles for library elending</u>, which are intended to guide library professionals as they grapple with the complicated process of negotiating eBook licenses with publishers and resellers.

The presentations from the IFLA, CILIP seminar on Ebooks and libraries are now <u>available</u>.

IFLA MLAS will now host a joint one-day session at the IFLA World Library and Information Congress (<u>WLIC</u>) in Singapore, in association with the Public Libraries Section, the Metropolitan Libraries Section and the Copyright and other Legal Matters (CLM) Committee. The session is tentatively scheduled for Monday 19thAugust.

IFLA and CILIP launched the Aspire Award in memory of CILIP's Chief Executive Bob McKee, who died in August 2010.
