The University of Calgary held the grand opening of the Taylor Family Digital Library on Oct. 20 at a ceremony attended by Calgary philanthropists Don and Ruth Taylor; Alberta Premier Alison Redford; Member of Parliament Blake Richards; and Calgary Mayor Naheed Nenshi.

The new state-of-the-art learning and research centre is a model for the 21st century library, and an important new gathering place for students, faculty, staff, alumni and the broader

Calgary community. The building opened to students and faculty the first week of September, and is already the new heart of the University of Calgary campus.

The Taylor Family Digital Library's unique features and resources include technology that encourages experiential learning, exploration and innovative ways of creating new knowledge. The facility is one of the most digitally progressive academic libraries in North America. It combines a library, art gallery, archives, rare collections, a student success centre, and the latest digital tools for learning and research, all using the most advanced technology available.



# (i) CLA Office Update


Weeks are going by at seemingly the speed of light. Here's an overview of some key activities at CLA HQ from the past month:

- Victoria Owen and I spent a day on the Hill discussing copyright issues – first on Bill C-11 with advisers to Ministers Moore and Clement, then on a draft WIPO SCCR treaty on limitations and exceptions for libraries and archives with department officials from Heritage, Industry and Foreign Affairs & International Trade.

- I attended the Ex Libris Association AGM in Toronto, and had the opportunity to make a presentation on CLA activity highlights from the past year.
- We announced the results of the election for the new 2012 CLA Executive Council. Congratulations to Pilar Martinez, Mary-Jo Romaniuk, Jennifer Evans, Karen Hildebrandt and John Tooth on their elections. President Karen Adams and the CLA staff look forward to working with the new Council.
- We're working on the re-development of CLA's IT infrastructure. We prepared an initial functional requirements document, and have started scouting potential vendors.
- The deadline for the call for proposals for the 2012 CLA National Conference was extended, and closes today. Make sure you get your submissions in for consideration! The Conference Program Standing Committee will meet in Toronto on 26-27 November.
- We're preparing for upcoming meetings of the Finance Committee (9 Dec) and Executive Council (10-11 Dec). This will be the final meeting of the transitional EC. Thanks to Past President Keith Walker, Treasurer Ingrid Langhammer, and Councillors Victoria Owen and Catherine Steeves for their great efforts over the past 6 months. They have had a busy time implementing the changes to CLA's structure approved by members in May, including approving the establishment of 19 Networks, making appointments to various Advisory and Standing Committees, and reviewing current and new policy documents.
