On July 6th, a train explosion that claimed the lives of an as yet undetermined number of people also destroyed roughly 40 buildings in the town's centre, including the Lac-Mégantic Public Library. Only two weeks away from moving to a new, larger location, the library and its contents of over 60,000 books and archival documents were completely obliterated.

3. CARL Calls for Transparent Trade Negotiations

Ottawa, 10 July 2013 - The Canadian Association of Research Libraries (CARL) calls on Canada and partner countries to open up the Trans-Pacific Partnership agreement to public deliberation. While they may have great economic potential, these negotiations must be transparent. Despite the TPP's wide ranging implications, Canadians will not be able to voice their comments when negotiators meet behind closed doors in Malaysia from July 15 to 25.
