## Canadian Library Association Library and Information Needs of Native Peoples Interest Group Mid-Year Update January 2004

- 1. Thank you to Jim Bruce, College Librarian, Nicola Valley Institute of Technology, for his ongoing commitment to and leadership of the Interest Group and the yahoo listserv. Ann Doyle, librarian, Xwi7xwa Library is serving as convenor of the group for the year 2003-04.
- 2. CLA/ALA Conference June 2003, Toronto Ontario The Interest Group offered three events at the Toronto conference:

Event 1: "Public Library services to U.S. and Canadian First Nations" was a joint session presented with the American Indian Library Association (AILA) convened by Jim Bruce, CLA Interest Group chair, (College Librarian, Nicola Valley Institute of Technology) and David Ongley, AILA, (Tuzzy Consortium Library of Barrow Alaska). The speakers included: Mary Anne Hansen of Montana State University – Bozeman libraries; Jean Whitehorse from the Tribal Libraries Program, New Mexico State Library; Wendy Sinclair of the Albert Community Branch of the Regina Public Library; Gene Joseph (Environmental Aboriginal Guardianship through Law - EAGLE) and Kim Lawson (Union of BC Indian Chiefs) from BC; Patty Lawlor of the Southern Ontario Library Services (SOLS); and Deborah Pelletier, Co-ordinator of Aboriginal Resources and Services - National Library and Archives of Canada.

Event 2: A First Nations Walking Tour was organized by Gloria Reinsberg, Spadina Public Library and Patty Lawlor. We began at the University of Toronto First Nations House with a warm welcome by elder Antoine and an introduction to the collection. We moved on to a display of historic materials at the Thomas Fisher Rare Book Library. Next stop was the newly renovated neighbourhood library at the Spadina branch of the Toronto Public Library. Many thanks to Gloria Reinsberg and Patty Lawlor for a wonderful tour and for the their work as the local arrangements committee with the able assistance of Janine Cheung.

<u>Event 3:</u> After the tour, we gathered for an educational program and lunch of traditional food co-ordinated by Robert Adams, Director of the Native Canadian Centre of Toronto We were introduced to the Toronto Native Community History project and the exemplary Visiting Schools program. Thank you to the National Library and Archives of Canada, Aboriginal Resources and Services for co-sponsoring this culturally rich and informative event.

Maureen Woods, newly appointed Director of the Public Library Services Branch, British Columbia will celebrate Canadian and B.C. public libraries that partner with First Nations to provide exemplary services to their communities, and discuss strategies for developing public library services with First Nations.
