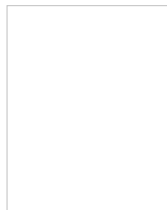

Call for Papers: Metropolitan Libraries Section

Theme: Disrupting and colliding: New trends for access, privacy, learning, empowerment and technology

Western University statement on Access Copyright negotiations

After several months of discussions in good faith by both parties, Western University has been unable to reach a new agreement with Access Copyright.

Western gave Access Copyright notice in June that the university did not wish to renew the existing agreement on its current terms, but would be prepared to discuss renewal at a substantially lower royalty rate that takes into account the changing copyright landscape and fairly values the service that Access Copyright provides.

University of Toronto and Access Copyright Negotiations: Statement

The University of Toronto announces that, despite good faith efforts by both parties, we have been unable to reach an agreement with Access Copyright for a renewal of the current License at a price that we believe fairly values the service that Access Copyright provides.

The University sought to obtain a License that reflected the significant evolution in copyright regulation that has occurred over the term of the current License, including the amendments to the Copyright Act in 2012, and the Supreme Court's expansive approach to the user right of fair dealing in its 2012 decisions. We also tried to obtain a royalty rate that took into account changing technology, increased availability of Open Access material, changing publishing practices, and changing user expectations.

Richmond's Community Infrastructure Receives Upgrades

The Honourable Alice Wong, Minister of State for Seniors and Member of Parliament for Richmond announced support for the Richmond Public Library under the Harper Government's Community Infrastructure Improvement Fund (CIIF).

In Economic Action Plan 2012, the Harper Government announced further support to help communities across the country modernize their infrastructure. The Government committed \$150 million over two years for the Fund. The Fund supports projects that look to improve existing community infrastructure accessible for use by the public, such as community centres, recreational buildings, local arenas, cultural and other community facilities.
