Thank you for contacting me regarding Bill C-625. I apologize for the delay in responding. I am pleased to support this bill.

It is important to remove the provision that could lead to the incarceration of someone failing to comply with a mandatory survey. All data should also be public domain with the permission of the individual after significant time has passed since its collection, as outlined in C-625.

While this bill is indeed a step in the right direction, further action must be taken to reverse the damage the Harper Conservatives have done to our ability to develop evidence-based policies. I share your disappointment with the defeat of Bill C-626. The elimination of the long-form census by a minority Conservative government in 2011 was a huge blow to data collection in Canada. In replacing the long-form census with a voluntary survey against the advice of Statistics Canada and without consulting parliament, the Harper Conservatives went against the will of the nation.
